



NEW: IACP's Law Enforcement National Data Exchange (N-DEX) Program
Alabama Chiefs of Police Association Winter Training Pre-Conference Workshop

Information sharing has become a mission critical component of today's public safety mandate for local, county, state, tribal and federal agencies to enhance crime fighting efforts. N-DEX is a powerful investigative tool that allows law enforcement agencies to submit and query incident data to make connections between persons, places, events, and crime characteristics – linking information across jurisdictions – allowing officers to 'connect the dots' between data that is not apparently related. The IACP, in partnership with the FBI, is delivering a communications and educational outreach program to promote awareness and use of N-DEX. This Alabama executive briefing will include Pete Fagan, retired Commander with the Virginia State Police, and Tim Bryan, former Alabama Police Chief and city manager who will conduct presentations on how individual agencies can participate in N-DEX. This workshop will discuss openly with the law enforcement community the foundation beneath and benefits of nationally sharing incident, offense, and arrest information between all agencies of all sizes through N-DEX.
